Masaryk University offers two types of summer schools (1) offered through the Centre for International Cooperation and (2) offered through the different faculties at the university. Many programs additionally travel to Prague, Budapest, and Vienna during their time here, enabling students to experience the best Central Europe has to offer!

LAB INTERNSHIPS

STEM students intern for 250 hours in universities labs with projects ranging from chemistry to biology to anthropology.

GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES: MEDIA, COMMUNICATION, CULTURE*

Students in this course will explore how globalization (as process, practice, and system) intersects evolving conceptions of media, communication and culture as international phenomena. Combining classes with site-visits to different companies, industries, and organizations to provide practical examples the course work in Brno, Prague, Vienna and Budapest.

INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL SUMMER SCHOOL*

Organized by: Faculty of Medicine

Incoming students have an opportunity to learn and work (4 hours a day, 4 days a week, 3 weeks in total) in specific workplaces and projects under the supervision of the Faculty's doctors focusing on: Anatomy Dissection of the Extremities, Practice in Physiology Labs, Clinical skills in Acute Patient.

SUMMER LAB RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS*

Masaryk University, in collaboration with CEITEC - one of the strongest research institutions in Central Europe, stands apart from other universities as a place to learn. Students work 250 hours over 8 weeks on projects in the fields of microbiology, biology, ecology, toxicology, chemistry, among others.

WORLD IN TRANSITION AND CENTRAL EUROPEAN TRANSFORMATION*

The program provides a broad understanding of state transformation issues in general and from the practical experience of the Czech Republic and its Central European neighbours draws knowledge for potential use in other countries around the world which are undergoing their own transformation/transition process.

COMMUNICATION INTERNSHIPS*

Summer internship opportunities within a spectrum of local, regional, and multinational companies in Brno are available for those students seeking an internship option beyond the beaten path to extend their international experiential acumen. Open to students of all majors.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT BOOT CAMP

Organized by: Faculty of Economics and Administration

This course is intended for those who wish to develop their skills and become profesionally certified in project management. The topics will range from project creation, risk management, budgeting and planning to the application of PRINCE2® as a standardised, best practice methodology. Students earn 3 internationally recognized professional certificates.

INTERNATIONAL LAW

In the judicial capital of the Czech Republic, students will attend classes on a range of subjects including European Union Law, Human Rights and Constitutional Law, as well as visit places such as the Ombudsman's office, the Constitutional Court in Brno.

LITERATURE, HISTORY AND CULTURE IN CENTRAL EUROPE*

In conjunction with the Authors' Reading Month, the largest literary festival in Central Europe, students in this program attend readings by a different Hungarian Author every night, after which they enjoy private discussions with the authors. During the day the students will learn about Hungarian history, literature and culture from different professors.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND THREATS TO GLOBAL SECURITY*

This program is designed to give students an understanding of some of the fundamental international security issues and their implications for Europe and the world.

ACADEMIC ENGLISH AND STUDY SKILLS

Organized by: Faculty of Arts

This program is a single module course aimed at improving the participants' academic English and study skills. During the 40 teaching hours, the participants will receive professional instruction (40 teaching hours, 45 minutes) by a team of experts in the field, some of whom are native English speakers.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL CONSERVATION SUMMER SCHOOL IN FLORENCE (ITALY)

The Summer School in archaeological conservation is a joint intensive program by Masaryk University, Centre of Prehistoric Archaeology of the Near East and CAMNES, the Center for Ancient Mediterranean and Near Easter Studies. It aims at introducing students to the restoration and conservation practices applied to archaeology.

CENTRAL EUROPE: A BIRTHPLACE OF MODERNITY

This course focuses on the historical, cultural and political developments taking place in Central Europe from the mid-nineteenth to the mid-twentieth century. The program of the summer school consists of daily seminars, lectures, a cultural program, excursions, and field trips.

CZECH CULTURE OF THE 20TH CENTURY

The school aims at familiarizing the students with the intricate interplay between the various radical innovations in the sciences and in the realm of culture (in philosophy, linguistics, literature, music, visual culture, and architecture) as they manifested themselves in the region against the backdrop of sweeping socio-political changes.

SUMMER SCHOOL OF SLAVONIC (CZECH) STUDIES
